Research Highlights

Improved School Grades

- Academic grades improved significantly across English, Maths, Science, Human Society
- Literacy (NAPLAN) improved by a one year gain to almost 100% with literacy above national minimum

Increased Attendance

 Absentee rates 65% lower in schools with The Song Room programs compared to matched peers


Social & Emotional Wellbeing

- Significant improvement in confidence, self-esteem, social and educational connection
- Reduced depression, anxiety, stress, loneliness and disengagement




School Engagement

Depression


Percentage of students who agreed with the statement 'During the past six months, I have felt so hopeless and down almost every day for one week that I have stopped doing my usual activities'


